1989-90 and 1990-91

In May we held the transition meeting on a deck overlooking White Bear Lake, at the home of Past President Ted Cardozo. Outgoing Board members reviewed some of the highlights of their term; incoming Board members talked about their plans and hopes for the upcoming year.

Membership Chair Julie Norwall streamlined the computerization of our membership list and *Loype* Editor John Holmquist learned to use the new publishing software we purchased to produce our newsletter. Contributors could now send the editor a disk.

Donna Mirocha, Secretary, skillfully kept minutes of the Board meetings and general Club meetings. In February she began to provide abbreviated minutes for the *Loype*. Barb Schaepe brought considerable experience with accounting to the job of Treasurer. She deposited income, paid Club expenses, and provided quarterly reports that brought good news of a balanced budget.

John Kimberly, Special Projects, coordinated *Ernie's Run*, the NSSTC booth at The Arctic Blast winter kickoff event, and the annual Spring Banquet. Inez Wick, Vice President, served in my absence at meetings and brought enthusiasm, stories and skills to several special projects. Inez, along with Rita Wetzel, wrote a menu guide, *The Care and Feeding of the North Star Ski Touring Club*, for lodge and resort owners and trip leaders. She also met with the "Soup Group, Trail Committee" and took honors as the most prolific trip leader. Jim Bauer, Trails Chair, worked with several other Club members to organize trail work outings during the fall.

Mike and Nancy Carlson, Program Chairs, put together several interesting programs for our monthly meetings. A couple of meetings focused on prevention and treatment of injuries related to Nordic skiing. Jinny McWethy, Corresponding Secretary, was the primary telephone contact for information about the Club and maintained communication with other clubs and friends around Minnesota and beyond. Arne Stefferud's first year as Government Liaison included keeping the Board informed of state trail plans and educating us about trail policies and issues.

After several years of discussion, the Board approved several amendments to the Club's Articles of Incorporation, Constitution, and By-laws in order to reflect the evolution of the Club in the areas of education, volunteer trail work, and the year-round schedule of activities. This set the stage to seek a change of status with the IRS as an educational and charitable 501C(3) organization. If approved, this new status would make contributions tax deductible and could reduce postage costs.

1991-92

Connie Donnelly, club President for 1991-92, summarized this year for us in January of 2008.

This was my second term as President of the NSSTC, the first being 1983-84.

The ski season got off to an early start due to the famous Halloween Blizzard of 1991. The flip side of that: the 5th Annual Ernie's Run, scheduled for November 2, was called off. There have been ski races cancelled for lack of snow, but never has a fun run been cancelled for too much snow!

John Holmquist, our Special Projects chair, had a very busy year. In addition to organizing Ernie's Run, he fielded three work crews to clean up our designated stretch of 35W for the Adopt-a-Highway program. He also coordinated club participation in the La La Palooza Loppet on January 25. The North Stars provided the bulk of the on-snow volunteers for this event. Finally, he was in charge of our annual Spring Banquet at the Sheraton Midway Hotel.

Al Porter was our Trail Development chair. Six weekend trail clearing trips were scheduled in September and October along with two day trips. Thirty-one people signed up for the Camp Northland trip. The trail fund coffers were so full that the board authorized \$1500 to be spent on a special project. Al appealed to members for suggestions.

Barb Wahman, Trips Coordinator, and Lorene Anderson, Singles Trips Coordinator, did a spectacular job of putting together two 18-page trip schedules (November and May). The western trip, led by Lee Mayer, went via Amtrak to the Izaak Walton Inn in Essex, Montana. Some skiers ventured into Glacier National Park for some back-country skiing. The North Star Classic Ski Race took place on February 1 at Aamodt's Apple Orchard. This 10K race was for members only and featured a special wood ski division. Fifty skiers finished the race which was organized by Jinny McWethy and Ted Cardozo. Charlie Evenson came in first with Belinda Hawkins as the first woman finisher.

Kathy Hawkins was our Publicity chair. The nominating committee consisted of Lucy Grams, chair, Arne Stefferud, and Linda Johnson. Membership chair, Bruce Nelson, reported in February that our numbers were eleven hundred, paid and growing. Jack Lynch did a fine job of presenting a variety of programs which he introduced with his inimitable panache. Solveig Olson, Treasurer, and Linda Peterson, Secretary, were indispensable to the smooth running of the club. Judy Curtis, Singles President, moved out of town in early 1992. Her term was completed by Rita Abrahamson.

Dana Siskind, Vice President, presided over the December meeting and cochaired the Presidents' Day Weekend Camp Northland trip along with yours truly. Thinking that the V.P. didn't have enough to do, the board decided to add organization of the August picnic to her job description. Gary Follett, our computer savvy *Loype* editor, had the most demanding job of all and handled it very well.

It was an outstanding year for the North Stars, thanks to the weather and to the hundreds of volunteers who led trips, staffed races and booths, and to all the members who participated in the events.

1992-93

This season marked the 25th anniversary of the North Star Ski Touring Club. Mother North Star, Jinny McWethy, offered in the pages of the *Loype* a personal retrospective of the club from one who has been there from the very beginning. Her columns were both entertaining and enlightening, and brought back fond memories to those lucky enough to have been with the club for many years. I think she chronicles so well the many ways that the NSSTC and the sport of ski touring have changed. It is safe to say that we remain one of the oldest, largest ski touring clubs in all of North America.

We end this season with about 1600 members. This is the largest membership base the North Star Ski Touring Club has ever enjoyed.

Two of the mainstays on our North Star calendar are Ernie's Run and the North Star Classic, heir apparent to the VJC. Both were relatively small, but successful, events. John Hollister, on wood skis, was the first North Star to cross the finish line, with Meg Schaeffer finishing first among women. The North Star Classic remains one of the few classic-only race/tours in the Twin Cities, and holds a special appeal for most of us.

As young families continue to become more active in our ranks, we will see, I believe, more and more of an expressed desire for affordable weekend trips. The fifth annual trip to Camp Onamia was a great success, with around seventy people filling the camp and a lengthy waiting list to boot.

This year's extended trip calendar included two week-long excursions to the Canadian Rockies near Banff—one led by Diane Plunkett and Sheila Merzer, the other led by Bruce Nelson. Cold weather and lots of sunshine provided the kind of exhilarating skiing we have come to expect in the mountains out west. The singles division organized trips to Thunder Bay and Whitefish, Montana (led by Rick Erickson and Rita Abrahamson) that were well attended. But the trip with the hardest ticket to get was the singles New Year's weekend trip to Telemark, attended by 20 lucky skiers with another 50 on the waiting list.

Other extended trips included a bicycle trip to/from Duluth and Bayfield, led by John Sisson, and a canoe trip in the Quetico, led by David Stevens and Jerry Norris.

Perhaps the most significant event this season was the founding of the Minnesota Youth Ski League. The real purpose of this league is to get kids on skis at an early age, to give them qualified instruction in a supportive environment, and to ultimately promote ski touring as a lifestyle sport. The North Star Ski Touring Club is proud to be a sponsor of the MYSL. We believe that we are making an investment of both time and money in an organization whose philosophies closely resemble ours. The well-being of the North Star Ski Touring Club ultimately lies in its youth. It should also be noted, as I conclude this accounting of the North Star season, that a new trips sign-up policy was instituted in November and seems to have worked quite well.

As a proponent of cross-country skiing all across the state, this club continues to be involved in a host of skier-related issues. This past year has seen us initiate some serious dialogue with the National Park Service regarding the potential for ski trails in Voyageurs National Park. The future of the park remains muddled at this writing, but it is clear that the interest of ski touring will be represented in any long-term planning. We as a club have voiced our objection to plans for a golf course at Giants Ridge that would threaten the existing ski trail system. And through Arne Stefferud, our government liaison, we have been monitoring trail issues around the state as well as the general well-being and administration of the Minnesota Ski Pass. We continue to be as visible as possible as the state's largest ski touring club.

1993-94

The end of the season finds this club as healthy as ever. We have nearly 1300 members, a year-round activities schedule that is the envy of most everyone around, and a treasury so well-stocked that we were able to spend \$5,000 on five different state-wide trail projects. This year saw the purchase of 15 first-aid kits to better prepare for the hazards of the trails that we explore. Jack Lynch and Ken Johnson did all the work on this one and deserve all the credit. The kits have been well received by the club, and many of our trip leaders are using them on a regular basis. Long overdue, they represent another good investment by this club.

Another major club purchase was a high-resolution laser printer for the *Loype*, making it possible for the editor to proof the layout at home. It was only six or seven years ago that our newsletter was handled largely by a commercial publishing company. Chuck Holst is the latest in a series of editors who have directed this movement toward desktop publishing. He has continued a tradition of putting together an interesting, polished publication that by itself makes your membership fee worthwhile.
